## Dear Women & Men,

Why such an unusual greeting? Because the signs in the lobby simply say “Women” and “Men”. When youth and adults enter the main building after being in a car or on a bus traveling to Rock Mountain they inevitably ask; **“Where’s the bathroom?”** The problem is, as excited as guests are to be at camp the condition of the restrooms is not as exciting.

Campers, guests, staff, even delivery people - everyone at Rock Mountain uses the lobby restrooms. I have no idea what the condition of their bathroom is at home, nor do I ask them. One thing I am confident of is that everyone appreciates a clean restroom.

I know our restrooms are cleaned three times a day, we use quality cleaning and sanitizing products, and a supervisor regularly checks the cleaning job. But I’m also aware that as things age, they often do not look as clean as they are. Instead of looking spotless and dazzling, they just look old; I’m afraid that’s the case for the lobby restrooms. For example, floor coverings that are deteriorating make them hard to scrub and, even after a painstaking wash they still “just look old.”

You can help us change that. My goal is to improve aesthetics, functionality and ease of cleaning. Due to the extent our facilities are used this project is all about timing. We have a window of opportunity in early spring just after our winter retreat season; in fact this is the only time of the year we can shut down the lobby restrooms without greatly inconveniencing our guests.

Our plan is to reconfigure the space to better accommodate those with handicaps, enhance modesty, and install easy to clean and durable surfaces, as well as the score of odds and ends that come with projects of this nature. I expect the project will require \$40,000.00. In addition to this year end appeal, proceeds from the annual golf tournament (May 19<sup>th</sup> 2012) will help fund this project.
